Lighting The Third Candle of Advent – Joy (Please remain seated)

(The first and second Candles of Advent are lit – Hope, and Peace)

L : It's the third Sunday of Advent. We are getting closer to the date we are waiting for - the day we celebrate the birth of Jesus. The Advent wreath is clothed in green, symbolizing life and growth found in Jesus.

This Sunday we light the candle that celebrates joy. The joy that we talk about when we think of Jesus is more than just feelings of happiness: it is also the experience that comes from falling deeper and deeper in love with all of God's creation.

Let us quiet our hearts and take a few moments to go deeper into our relationship with Christ that brings us joy. Close your eyes or focus on the candles. Breathe gently. Look for the joy that lives in all of us, the joy that comes from knowing that Jesus loves and cares for us and offers us hope for better things to come in this world. Let that joy grows spread throughout your being. Relax and be uplifted by that joy right now.
