# Extinguishing the Fourth Candle of Lent: Repentance

L: We have been born into a world of sin. We try to do the right thing, but at times we fail, and temptation seems to win. 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The sculpture of a Brazen Serpent of Moses Memorial Church, Nehushtan, is the serpentine cross that stands on the terrace of Mount Nebo was created by the Italian artist Giovanni Fantoni.

It recalls the bronze serpent on a pole which God told Moses to erect to protect his people from the poisonous snakes that God had sent as punishment. It was enough to look at the bronze serpent erected by prophet Moses in order to be healed and saved.
